- If you are considering becoming a member at St. John, we ask that you begin by
 visiting with a pastor and attending a new member coffee, held four times each year.

- Personal amplifiers for the hearing impaired are available. Please ask an usher.
- Children's worship bags are in the narthex and the Commons Area.
- <u>Childcare:</u> Children are always welcome in worship, but if a parent feels that little
 hands, feet and voices are making it difficult for others to worship, the nursery is open
 and staffed at the 10:30 a.m. service. If a child needs a shorter break, there is wiggle
 room and a glider chair in the narthex.
- <u>Holy Communion</u> is celebrated at each worship service. The table is open to all who
 believe in the redeeming power of Christ's love. You may stand or kneel and receive
 the bread and wine. If you prefer a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, simply ask the
 person serving.
- <u>The decision about when a child should commune is made by the parent.</u> We encourage families to visit with a pastor to learn about the sacrament before communing for the first time. Children communing should extend their hands. Children not communing are invited to fold their hands.
- <u>Coffee is served</u> in the Commons Area before Sunday worship services.
- St. John is a member congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and part of the Western North Dakota Synod. St. John is a corporate member of Badlands Ministries Bible Camp and St. Luke's Nursing Home. Congregations in the WND and Eastern North Dakota Synods, including St. John, own Lutheran Social Services of N.D., a private, nonprofit social services agency.

~ <u>Introductions to the Readings</u> ~

Ezekiel 18:1-4, 25-32 - Ezekiel challenges those who think they cannot change because of what their parents were and did, or who think they cannot turn from their wicked ways. God insistently invites people to turn and live.

Philippians 2:1-13 - As part of a call for harmony rather than self-seeking, Paul uses a very early Christian hymn that extols the selflessness of Christ in his obedient death on the cross. Christ's selfless perspective is to be the essential perspective we share as the foundation for Christian accord.

Matthew 21:23-32 - After driving the moneychangers out of the temple (21:12), Jesus begins teaching there. His authority is questioned by the religious leaders, who are supposed to be in charge of the temple.
