- If you are considering becoming a member at St. John, we ask that you begin by
 visiting with a pastor and attending a new member coffee or meal, held four times

- Children's worship bags are in the narthex and the Commons Area.
- <u>Childcare:</u> Children are always welcome in worship, but if a parent feels that little
 hands, feet and voices are making it difficult for others to worship, the nursery is
 staffed during the 10:30 a.m. service. If a child needs a shorter break, there is wiggle
 room and a glider chair in the narthex.
- Holy Communion is celebrated at each worship service. The table is open to all who
 believe in the redeeming power of Christ's love. You may stand or kneel and receive
 the bread and wine. If you prefer a gluten-free wafer or grape juice, simply ask the
 person serving.
- The decision about when a child should commune is made by the parent. We
 encourage families to visit with a pastor to learn about the sacrament before
 communing for the first time. Children communing should extend their hands.
 Children not communing are invited to fold their hands.
- <u>Coffee is served</u> in the Commons Area before Sunday worship services.
- St. John is a member congregation of the **Evangelical Lutheran Church in America** and part of the **Western North Dakota Synod**. St. John is a corporate member of Badlands Ministries Bible Camp and St. Luke's Nursing Home. ELCA and LCMS congregations in western and eastern North Dakota own Lutheran Social Services of N.D., a private, nonprofit social services agency.

Zephaniah 3:14-20- The prophet Zephaniah's message is mostly one of judgment for sin. This reading, however, which comes from the conclusion of the book, prophesies joy for Judah and Jerusalem. Judgment has led to repentance, and God's salvation is at hand.

Philippians 4:4-7- Despite being in prison, Paul is remarkably upbeat as he writes this letter. Here, he urges his friends in Philippi to trust God with all their worries and concerns, with the hope they will experience God's joy and peace.

<u>Luke 3:7-18</u>- John the Baptist heralds the mighty one "who is coming." John teaches that preparation for God's reign is not a matter of identity but of bearing fruits of merciful justice, radical generosity, and vocational integrity.
